THE MANY WONDERS OF GOD'S CREATION

SYMBIOSIS : SURPRISING ANIMAL TEAM UPS

The Remora Fish usually attach to the shark's underbelly and eat scraps of prey dropped by the shark. They benefit the shark by eating parasites on the shark's skin and mouth that would otherwise irritate and harm the shark.

Zebra's and Ostriches look out for each other. Zebra's have a great sense of smell and hearing but they have poor eye sight. While the ostrich has great vision but not great hearing or smell. They often travel together and warn each other when danger is coming. Each animal benefiting from the strength of the other animal.

Egyptian Plovers and Crocodiles have a unique symbiotic relationship. Crocodiles are unable to clean their teeth which easily get clogged with food debris and leading to tooth decay. When the need arises the crocodile will open its mouth widely and permit the plover to be its dental hygienist, and bonus the bird with a useful meal.

Boxer Crabs and Sea Anemones form one of the most unusual and astounding symbiotic relationships in the entire animal kingdom. These crabs wield sea anemones attached to their claws in horizontal motions as they move. This colourful display serves as a natural deterrent to predators, and when directly threatened, the crab will utilise the sea anemone in a forward, 'punching ' movement towards the aggressor. The sea anemone's stinging tentacles serve as the ultimate defence mechanism for the crab.

Moray Eels and Cleaner Shrimps have a unique symbiotic relationship. Moray eels live in rock recesses in tropical waters as solitary creatures. The shrimp congregate in teams called a 'cleaning station 'and move across the whole body of the eel – including inside the mouth – removing parasites and dead skin, which is their food. This cleaning ensures good health for the eel, so both species benefit.

Yellow-billed Oxpeckers and Impala have a tick removal relationship that is very fine tuned. Impala are successful in removing ticks from their body that they can reach with their teeth. However when it comes to the inaccessible parts of their body....head, neck and ears....where tick loads build up, the Oxpecker duly obliges the Impala by zoning in on these areas to have his meal and do his pest removal.

Gobies and Pistol Shrimps, in some cases will form mutualistic relationships. Pistol shrimps may share their sandy burrow on the sea floor with gobies, and also stick together outside of the burrow. When the goby spots a potential predator, it uses chemical cues and bolts for cover in the shared burrow. The shrimp relies on these tactile and chemical cues to know when it needs to hide, too.
